

Regulation Code: 6315 7110 R&P Transportation Responsibilities Bus Driver Qualifications

Bus driver qualifications:

- ~~A. Must be 18 years old;~~
- ~~B. Must possess a valid North Carolina driver's license;~~
- ~~C. Must have had a valid driver's license for a minimum of two years;~~
- ~~D. With 2-4 years total driving experience, no more than one ticket or at-fault accident during that period;~~
- ~~E. With 5-9 years driving experience, no more than two tickets or two at-fault accident during that period;~~
- ~~F. With 10 or more years experience, no more than two tickets and one at-fault accident, or two at-fault accidents and one ticket during that time period;~~
- ~~G. No convictions of DWI in the last 10 years;~~
- ~~H. No convictions of reckless driving in the last 10 years;~~
- ~~I. No conviction for passing a school bus in the process of making a passenger stop;~~
- ~~J. No suspension of driving privileges in the last 10 years due to a moving violation (a suspension for failure to appear does not count);~~
- ~~K. Any prospective driver who has had a license in another state within the last five years must provide a driving record from that state, as well as possess a valid NC driver's license;~~

A. Qualifications

1. Must be 18 years old.
2. Must possess a valid NC driver's license.
3. Must have had a valid driver's license for a minimum of two years.
4. Must take class and pass examinations administered by DMV and receive CDL with "S" and "P" endorsements.

B. Within past 12 months

1. No conviction of any moving violation.
2. No pending charge of any moving violation.
3. No more than one charge of any moving violation, regardless of disposition.

C. Within past 60 months

1. No more than three charges of moving violations of any kind.

2. No conviction of a moving violation combined with any other charge of a moving violation.
3. No charge of DWI or DUI.
4. No charge for reckless driving.
5. No charge for passing a stopped school bus.

D. Within past 10 years

1. No suspension or revocation of the driving privilege, other than for such status offenses as lapsed insurance, failure to appear in court, and failure to comply with out-of-state citation; provided that there be no more than one suspension or revocation for such status offenses within the past 10-years.

E. Indefinite

1. No more than one charge of DWI or DUI.
