Subject: Summer School Programs in 2022

For Summer 2022, the Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) requests permission to operate summer programs for all schools with readministration of End-of-Grade (EOG) and End-of-Course (EOC) tests, as per the allowances and guidelines of the September 13, 2021 NCDPI memo titled “2021-22 Summer Programs”. The scope of our planned summer programs is detailed below.

Purpose of the WCPSS summer program with EOG and EOC readministration:

- Facilitate intensive learning experiences for students who have not yet met minimal proficiency requirements in the areas measured by EOGs and EOCs
- Increase overall student mastery of standards
- Strengthen student foundational skills in preparation for success in subsequent courses moving into 2022-23

Who is eligible to attend:

All students who pass an EOG or EOC-tested course or subject in 2021-22 but score Not Proficient on the initial administration of the EOG or EOC will be eligible to attend. Attendance for eligible students will be voluntary. Any eligible student who does not participate in summer program activities during the remediation window will not be eligible for readministration of any EOG or EOC.

The dates the program will occur, to include days for remediation and readministrations:

Due to the fact that WCPSS operates multiple instructional calendars, exact dates will vary by school. Each school will select two days on which to offer re-administration of EOG and EOC tests within the specified window following the conclusion of their summer remediation program. The table below

details the starting and ending dates for each school’s remediation and readmnistration windows based on calendar type.

Year-Round Schools Tracks 2, 3, 4 <i>(last day of school is June 29)</i>	June 30-July 8	June 30-July 8*

Length (hours/minutes) provided daily for remediation/readministrations:

Specific schedules for remediation will vary by school and will be determined closer to the end of the school year in conjunction with each school’s Area Superintendent, depending on staffing and the number of eligible students who choose to participate. Families will receive notification of the schedule from their child’s school later this spring. For readministrations, each school will try to set aside at least two days for readministrations to allow for students to be readministered multiple EOG or EOC tests if necessary.

Security of test materials:

Test coordinators and test administrators will be thoroughly trained and will maintain test security at the school level throughout the summer program administration. Tests will be administered in accordance with the state Assessment Guide and all other applicable state publications. Any paper/pencil test materials for accommodated students will remain secure at all times and will be returned to the Testing Office immediately upon the conclusion of testing.
