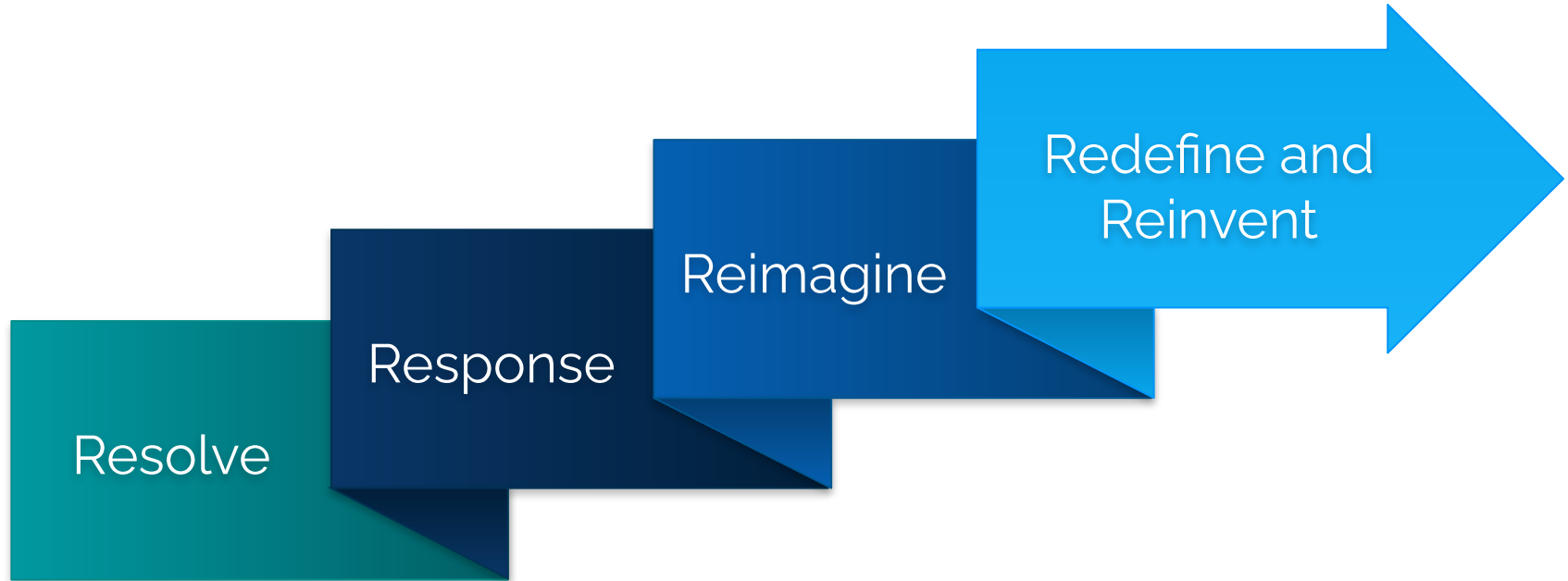

2022 Summer Learning - Program Overview

- Read to Achieve & Power Scholars (Elementary)
- Credit Recovery (High School)
- CTE Career Accelerator (High School)



2022 Read to Achieve Program

Purpose: To provide an additional education program outside of the instructional calendar as a literacy intervention for students in grades 2 & 3 who demonstrate difficulty with reading development.

Summer 2022 Overview

- 10-12 days of instruction (June-September)
- 354 Teachers, 71 Instructional Assistants, 38 Leads
- 62 school sites
- 2189 students
- Transportation, breakfast & lunch provided
- YMCA Power Scholars Program (Bugg & Poe Elementary Schools)





2022 Read to Achieve Program - Student Outcomes

- 50% more 3rd grade students moved from non-proficient at the beginning of camp to proficient by the end of camp 2022 as compared to 2021.
- One third of 3rd grade students with completed assessments increased 10 points or more in their composite score.



2022 Read to Achieve Program - Perception Data (Families, Students, Staff)

276 Parent Respondents

- 92% agreed attending reading camp was beneficial to their child.
 - Child being a more confident reader, increased fluency, and is excited about reading
- 91% agreed they would recommend reading camp to another parent or caregiver.

1,189 Student Respondents

- 87% agreed reading camp was fun.
 - Helped to become better with reading, writing, and learning

252 Teacher Respondents

- 80% are returning camp teachers
- 78% agree that camp was beneficial to students

2022 Power Scholars Program - Partnership with YMCA

5-Week Program

- Math, Literacy & Enrichment (Field Trips)
- K-5 students from Bugg & Poe elementary schools
- 20+ WCPSS employees
- YMCA: salaries and program expenses including field trips
- WCPSS: facilities, meals, transportation and liaison





Power Scholars Program-Partnership with YMCA

108 Students Participated

- 98% attendance rate
- 99% retention rate
- Students gained 2 months literacy knowledge as measured by STAR Literacy.
- Students maintained math knowledge and did not experience summer slide as measured by STAR Math.

Perception Data

- 93% of staff described the experience as rewarding.
- 100% of families said their children enjoyed the program and would recommend the program to others.
- 93% of 4th & 5th grade students said they enjoyed the program.
- 100% of 4th and 5th grade students said they trusted their program teachers.



High School Credit Recovery Program

Purpose: To provide high school students with an opportunity to recover credits with the goal of staying on track to promotion or graduation.

Summer 2022

- Expanded access by increasing available seats for summer credit recovery.
- 2920 credits earned through credit recovery
- 82 summer graduates

CTE Career Accelerator Program

Purpose: Provide opportunities for experiences that students may not have experienced during the pandemic.

Programs included:

- Credential Boot Camps
- Career Accelerator
- Builder's Bridge
- Ace Mentor
- District C Teamship
- Red Hat Academy

685 students enrolled to participate in this summer program; 176 participated.

Career Accelerator Program

Outcomes: Greater Career Awareness

As a result of this summer program...

- 100% reported that they learned new things about jobs/careers
- 95.7% felt better prepared to make decisions about their own learning
- 87% reported greater motivation to work hard
- 84.1% felt better prepared for the next grade level

Looking Ahead to 2023–Summer Math Enrichment Program *(New)*

Summer Math Enrichment Program

- Focus on conceptual and skill deficits
- Summer Math “Transition Institute” for rising 6th and 9th graders
- Eligibility Determination
 - 21-22 EOG Scores
 - 21-22 EOY STAR math data
 - 21-22 Dreambox usage/focus skill data
 - 22-23 BOY STAR math Data
- Will be offered in both Summer 2023 and Summer 2024

Looking Ahead to 2023–Summer Bridge Academy *(New)*

Summer Bridge Academy (Rising 6th and 9th Grade Students)

- Partner with Read to Achieve Camp & Summer Math Enrichment
- K-12 Instructional Support programming for ML, AIG, and Title I
- Minimum of 50 hours of programming, no less than 25 of which will be dedicated to academic learning acceleration (i.e. appropriate grade-level content)
 - Remaining hours of programming focused on supporting the social, emotional, and mental health needs of students
- Highly effective teachers in small group settings
- Eligibility Determination
 - K-8: mClass reading data, STAR Math assessment data, course grades in current grade-level work
 - 9-12: course grades and credit attainment
