This initiative reflects a commitment to the holistic well-being of students, efficient resource utilization, and the overall improvement of the educational experience within the community. It aligns with the broader goals of safety, accessibility, and operational excellence in the school district.

*Why?*

- a. **Safety:** Ensuring the safety of students during transportation is a top priority. A streamlined transportation system can include measures such as route optimization, regular vehicle maintenance, and implementing safety protocols to minimize risks and accidents.
- b. **Efficiency:** An efficient transportation system helps in optimizing resources, reducing costs, and minimizing disruptions. By streamlining routes and utilizing technology, the school district can maximize the use of transportation resources, making the entire system more cost-effective. Possible solutions would have redistricting put a higher emphasis on transportation needs during the planning process.
- c. **Accessibility:** Enhancing accessibility involves addressing issues related to transportation barriers that students may face. This could include improving bus stop locations, providing alternative transportation options, and ensuring that students with special needs have the necessary accommodations to access transportation services.
- d. **Punctuality:** A well-organized transportation system contributes to the punctuality of students, helping them arrive at school on time. This is crucial for their academic success and ensures that instructional time is not compromised due to transportation delays.
- e. **Parental Confidence:** An efficient and safe transportation system contributes to parental confidence in the school district. When parents feel assured that their children are transported safely and reliably, it positively impacts their perception of the overall educational experience.
- f. **Environmental Impact:** Streamlining transportation can also have positive environmental effects. Optimizing routes and encouraging the use of environmentally friendly transportation options can reduce the carbon footprint associated with student transportation. This would be enhanced by my point made in section b) - the emphasizing of transportation considerations within the redistricting process. I strongly believe that students that are able to walk/bike to school should have the ability and encouragement to do so safely.

- g. **Budgetary Considerations:** An effective transportation plan contributes to better budget management. By optimizing routes, reducing fuel consumption, and improving efficiency, the school district can allocate resources more effectively, ensuring that funds are used wisely.

## 2. Staff Recruitment and Retention

*Implementing strategic measures to attract and retain high-quality educators, fostering a positive working environment that contributes to the overall success of our schools.*

This initiative underscores the recognition that educators are a fundamental asset to the success of a school district. It demonstrates a commitment to creating a positive and supportive environment that benefits both staff and students and contributes to the long-term success of the educational institution.

*Why?*

- a) **Quality Education:** High-quality educators significantly impact the quality of education provided to students. By attracting and retaining skilled and motivated staff, the school district can ensure that students receive the best possible learning experiences, leading to improved academic outcomes.
- b) **Continuity and Stability:** High turnover rates among staff can lead to disruptions in the learning environment. Establishing strategies to retain experienced teachers and staff fosters continuity, stability, and a consistent educational approach, which is beneficial for both students and the overall school community.
- c) **Positive School Culture:** A positive working environment contributes to a positive school culture. When teachers and staff feel valued, supported, and engaged, they are more likely to create a positive and nurturing atmosphere in the classroom. This, in turn, enhances the overall learning experience for students.
- d) **Professional Development:** Recruitment and retention efforts often include provisions for ongoing professional development. This contributes to the continuous improvement of staff skills and knowledge, which is essential for staying current with educational best practices and meeting the evolving needs of students.
- e) **Competitive Advantage:** In a competitive job market, having a strategic plan for staff recruitment and retention gives the school district a competitive advantage. It can help attract top-tier educators and staff who are seeking a supportive and rewarding work environment.
- f) **Community Confidence:** The quality of the teaching staff is often a key factor in shaping community perception of the school district. A strategic focus on attracting and retaining high-quality educators can enhance community confidence and support for the school system.

- g) **Cost Savings:** Recruiting and training new staff members can be resource intensive. By focusing on retention, the school district can potentially reduce turnover-related costs, such as recruitment expenses, training programs, and the time required for new staff to acclimate.
- h) **Teacher Morale and Job Satisfaction:** Job satisfaction and morale among teachers have a direct impact on their effectiveness in the classroom. A positive working environment, opportunities for professional growth, and supportive leadership contribute to higher levels of job satisfaction and, consequently, improved teaching performance.

### 3. **Student Safety**

***Developing comprehensive safety protocols and initiatives to create a secure learning environment for all students, addressing both physical and mental well-being.***

This initiative aligns with the broader goal of preventing (cyber)bullying and creating an environment conducive to focused learning where students can thrive.

*Why?*

- a) **Physical Safety:** Establishing comprehensive safety protocols ensures that students are protected from physical harm, accidents, and emergencies. This includes implementing measures such as emergency response plans, security procedures, and creating a physically secure campus environment.
- b) **Mental Well-being:** Addressing mental well-being is equally crucial. Students facing mental health challenges should have access to support services, counseling, and resources. A strategic plan that recognizes and prioritizes mental well-being contributes to a more holistic approach to student safety.
- c) **Prevention of Bullying:** Student safety involves fostering a culture that prevents bullying. The strategic plan should include initiatives to promote a positive school culture, educate students on the impact of bullying, and implement measures to promptly address and prevent instances of bullying. This would include curbing phone/social media usage.
- d) **Reduction of Distractions:** In line with point c), excessive social media and phone use can be distracting for students, affecting both their academic performance and overall well-being. Ideally, this can be addressed by implementing guidelines or policies that limit phone use during school hours, promoting a focused and conducive learning environment.
- e) **Mitigation of Hate Crimes:** As recently reported by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), schools are the third-highest location for hate crimes to occur in the United States. Therefore, policies should increase measures to mitigate hate crimes and promote tolerance and inclusivity. This involves education programs, awareness campaigns, and clear policies against discrimination to create an environment where all students feel safe and respected.

- f) **Emergency Preparedness:** Developing and regularly practicing emergency preparedness drills ensures that students and staff are well-prepared to respond to various emergency situations, including natural disasters or other crises.
- g) **Parental Involvement:** Inclusion of safety initiatives in the strategic plan encourages communication with parents about safety measures in place. This involvement helps build a collaborative effort between the school and parents to prioritize and maintain a safe learning environment.
- h) **Legal Compliance:** Having comprehensive safety protocols aligns with legal requirements and standards. Schools must comply with regulations related to student safety, and a strategic plan provides a framework for achieving and maintaining compliance.
- i) **Enhanced Reputation:** A school district that prioritizes student safety builds a positive reputation in the community. Parents, students, and the community at large are more likely to support and trust an educational institution that prioritizes the safety and well-being of its students.

I acknowledge that I do not have all the solutions readily available on how to achieve my proposed initiatives and that these are items already being heavily worked on; however, in trying to achieve set goals, I strive to examine the benefits and potential downsides in any solution or path that might be taken. I consider my decision-making process to be fact-based yet compassionate, which as a member of the WCPSS board would be a beneficial attribute to come to consensus as a board but also provide smart and empathetic votes for the benefit of the public.

A security deposit may also be required.

### Electric service does not depend on payment for other products or services

Non-payment for non-regulated products or services (such as surge protection or equipment service contracts) may result in removal from the program but will not result in disconnection of electric service.

### When you pay by check

We may process the payment as a regular check or convert it into a one-time electronic check payment.

### Late payment charges

A late payment charge of 1.0% will be added for any past due utility balance not paid by the due date.

### Storm Recovery Charge

This bill charge was approved in a financing order issued to DEP by the NCUC to recover storm recovery property. As approved by the NCUC, a special purpose entity is the owner of the rights to collect the storm recovery charge and DEP acts as the agent collecting for the special purpose entity.
