Abstract

United States (U.S.) Department of State, U.S. Embassy Jakarta Public Affairs Section, Public Diplomacy Grants Program provides funding for small projects that support a strategic partnership between Indonesia and the United States. The State Department will consider projects that include a priority program area and demonstrate the ability to promote an increased understanding of U.S. policy and perspectives. Grant projects may include educational seminars, professional and academic exchanges, professional development workshops and training, artistic and cultural workshops, and more.

Columbus State University in Columbus, Georgia is submitting an application proposing a collaboration with the University of Bengkulu (in Sumatra, Indonesia), and has invited Wake Early College of Information and Biotechnologies (WECIB) to participate. The grant project will involve a cultural exchange focused on project based learning in the areas of Strategic Partnerships, Technology and Innovation, and Education and Human Capacity. If approved, WECIB will host four Indonesian educators and participate in the development of an international consortium of educators engaged in STEM education.

Wake Early College of Information and Biotechnologies has been invited to participate.
